Established in 2009 by GlaxoSmithKline and Pfizer, with Shionogi joining in 2012, ViiV Healthcare was created to take an innovative approach to the challenge of HIV — and we do. We're a diverse team of more than 1,300 scientists, innovators, and believers who have been fighting HIV and supporting those affected by it since the epidemic began.



Our scientists have been on the front lines developing treatments since the start of the HIV and AIDS epidemic, and today our broad portfolio includes 16 HIV Medicines in six antiretroviral classes.



We develop and support community programs – with and for the HIV community – that focus on engaging people in care and tackling stigma.

From our beginnings at the start of the epidemic, we've taken a panoramic approach to HIV research, using science to improve lives from all angles.



Our facility in Branford, Connecticut, is the only site 100% dedicated to HIV research. It houses both the discovery and development phases of our clinical HIV research, promoting a collaborative approach to accelerating innovation. We're working together with one purpose: develop HIV medicines that meet the needs of the community.



Since 2015, we have partnered with the HIV Cure Center at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill on a joint venture known as Qura Therapeutics to foster innovation and the discovery of new medicines. By merging our expertise, we're working to source the best science and thinking from around the world to accelerate research breakthroughs and novel approaches.



Our pioneering Implementation Science program seeks to identify and resolve the numerous barriers that emerge in the real-world delivery of HIV care. Through these research efforts, we're committed to improving everything from initial testing and diagnosis to care access and treatment adherence, so that no individual is left behind in our collective goal of ending the HIV epidemic.

Our Positive Action programs provide community organizations with grants to expand their work and engage people who are most disproportionately impacted by HIV.

The accelerate Initiative is ViiV Healthcare's commitment to support a range of community-driven activities that strengthen the health and well-being of Black gay and bisexual men. The initial four-year, \$10 million investment was in two cities hardest hit by HIV—Baltimore, Maryland, and Jackson, Mississippi.
