What will happen today:

- You and your medical provider will talk about parenting, your home, your baby's health and safety, and keeping your baby happy and healthy
- Your baby may need one or more shots if any were missed
- Your medical provider will address any concerns you have



Lead Testing

What is lead?

- Lead is a poison found in older homes and even in some toys
- Even a small amount of lead can hurt your child's brain, blood, and kidneys

Where does lead come from?

- Lead was used in house paints until the 1970s
- Lead can still be found in dust from old paint, the soil, and in some water supply pipes and plumbing

What can I do to protect my child?

- · Get your child tested today!
- · Wash your child's hands many times a day
- Wash toys and pacifiers
- If worried about lead, call the Child Lead Program at 215-685-2797





<u>Sleep</u>

- Put your baby to sleep when they are tired and not all the way to sleep
- Your baby will learn to soothe themself to sleep this way

Development

- Pulls to stand; rolls over to sit up
- Early two-finger grasp; bangs toys together
- Waves bye-bye; plays patty-cake
- Says mama and dada randomly
- 2 syllable sounds

Staying Healthy for 9 Month Olds

Social **200** It's normal for a baby to be attached to its parents and get Give your baby lots of safe toys and Help your baby learn by reading, upset around strangers talking and singing with them a safe place to play with them **Feeding** Let your baby try different kinds of foods with different tastes and Your baby should be ready to use textures Give 3 meals a day with 2 or 3 snacks a sippy cup Safety Keep your baby away from things that are too small because it could Keep heavy or hot things away from Car seats should always be in the back where your baby could pull them down of the car, facing towards the back cause choking What to Expect Your baby will start to stand and Your baby will start to say words Your baby will follow directions may even take a few steps like "mama" and "dada" like "come here" or "get the ball"

At the next visit:

- Your child will have a physical exam
- They may receive shots
